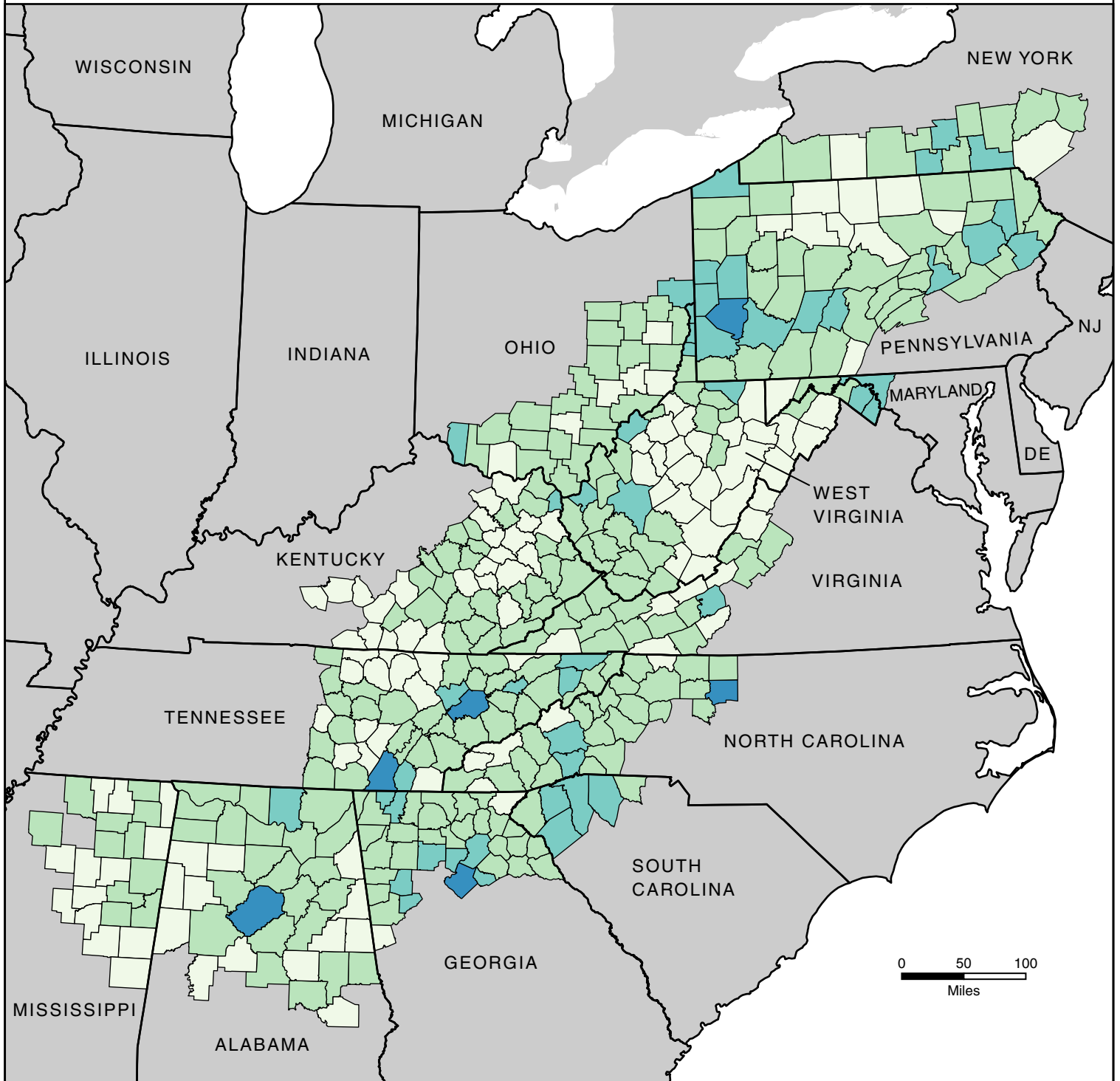


Population Density in Appalachia, 2000



Population density is a measure of the dispersion of people, which is calculated by dividing the 2000 census population by the 1990 land area in square miles. Land area for the year 2000 will be used when available from the U.S. Census Bureau.

U.S. average = 79.6
Appalachian average = 114.0
